INTRODUCE SAY: We are writing personal narratives about the house-building challenge. We have done the P (plan), O (organize), and W (write) steps in the writing process with the prompt. TEACH: Remind students what they have completed so far in their personal narratives to respond to the prompt. They have already written the beginning and the middle in the previous lessons. Remind students that a narrative needs a beginning, middle, and ending. STUDENTS: Turn and talk to tell a partner what parts of their personal narrative they have completed. Go over today's objectives with students.	SAY: We learned about some different kinds of transition words. We are learning the week about pronouns. A pronoun takes the place of a noun. Some examples of pronouns are he, her, she, and it. Just like there are different kinds of nouns, there are different kinds of pronouns. TEACH: Explain the pronoun types on the slide. Subjunct pronouns were also taught in Unit 1, week 2. A subjunct pronoun is a pronoun that is the subject of the sentence. An objective pronoun is a pronoun that refers to a person, place, or thing that is not specific. Indefinitely, sometimes, everywhere, always, somewhere, anywhere, etc. (A possessive pronoun shows ownership: mine, yours, his, hers, etc.) Teacher note: The goal is for the students to be able to recognize pronouns by type, but to understand that those words are also pronouns and take the place of a noun in a sentence. SAY: Let's read the paragraph to find out more about what a journey does. TEACH: Teacher reads the paragraph aloud. The first line is just to understand the context of the paragraph. Read the paragraph a second time. STUDENTS: Students follow along and circle pronouns in the paragraph.		
PRACTICE SAY: In narrative writing, it is important to use transition words. These can also be called temporal words. Transition words move the story forward to show the sequence, or order of events. This helps the reader understand what things in the story are happening. STUDENTS: Turn and talk to share some transition words they have used or read before. SAY: We will watch a video to learn a narrative story about a journey. TEACH: Show the video. STUDENTS: Watch the video and look for parts of a narrative. SAY: As we learned in the video, there is a journey around the world in 70 days. We will read a short narrative about the journey. TEACH: Read the narrative to students, stopping the video. Explain that it sounded like the journey and was hard to follow because it was moving through a world. Then, read the transition words in the narrative to students. Write the missing transition words in the video and read the narrative again to show how much easier it is to follow a story when there are transition words. STUDENTS: Fill in the missing transition words on their papers. Go over self-reflection using the self-regulation slide.	SAY: You will need the page from our last lesson where you wrote the middle / events in your personal narrative. TEACH: Explain the think, say, write routine today using the steps on the slide. STUDENTS: Students will look for transition words they already have in their narrative and lightly underline them. They will also add other transition words to their personal narrative.		
INTERVENTION Give students specific transition words to use in their writing. If students have a hard time fitting in the transition words on their writing, show them how to write between lines.	INTERVENTION Provide students with additional paper if they have more to write than fits on their page. Students can revisit other narratives writing to add transition words, such as their comic book or personal narratives.
