BOOK JACKET Globalization and Educational Rights Joel Spring, 2014-04-08 This is the first book to explore the meaning of equality and freedom of education in a global context and their relationship to the universal right to education It also proposes evaluating school systems according to their achievement of equality and freedom Education in the 21st century is widely viewed as a necessary condition for the promotion of human welfare and thus identified as a basic human right Educational rights are included in many national constitutions written since the global spread of human rights ideas after World War II But as a global idea the meaning of educational rights varies between civilizations In this book which builds on the concept of the universal right to education set forth in Spring's *The Universal Right to Education* Justification Definition and Guidelines his intercivilizational analysis of educational rights focuses on four of the world's major civilizations Confucian Islamic Western and Hindu Spring begins by considering educational rights as part of the global flow of ideas and the global culture of schooling He also considers the tension this generates within different civilizational traditions Next he proceeds to examine the meaning of educational rights in the Confucian tradition in the recent history of China and in the Chinese Constitution look at educational rights in the context of Islamic civilization and as presented in the constitutions of Islamic countries including an analysis of the sharp contrast between the religious orientation of Islamic educational rights and those of China and the West explore the problems created by the Western natural rights tradition and the eventual acceptance of educational rights as represented in European constitutions with a focus on the development and prominence given in the West to the relationship between schooling and equality of opportunity and investigate the effect of global culture on India and the blend of Western and Hindu ideas in the Indian constitution highlighting the obstacles to fulfillment of educational rights created by centuries of discrimination against women and lower castes In his conclusion Spring presents an educational rights statement based on his intercivilizational analysis and his examination of national constitutions This statement is intended to serve as a model for the inclusion of educational rights in national constitutions

America Goes to School Robert M. Hardaway, 1995-04-30 This book documents the shocking state of public education in the United States including the high rates of school violence the decline in student achievement and the politicization of the educational process By comparing the performance of public schools with private schools which spend less than half per capita than public counterparts the book reveals areas in which public education might reduce administrative overhead eliminate internal segregation of students and provide a safe and disciplined learning environment Also suggested are ways in which public schools might learn from the experience and

Cobb, 1992 Choice in education is an issue of community empowerment As Clifford W Cobb demonstrates in this persuasive look at school choice the most effective schools are those founded in a community of parents students and teachers working together toward shared goals Cobb maintains that this kind of mutually supportive organization is essential to rescue not only our children s education but also the communities that protect us from the increasing domination of our lives by large bureaucratic institutions We must begin he believes to trust parents to choose the schools that best serve their needs and the needs of their children or to start their own schools if they have to This book makes a convincing case that the best way to achieve meaningful choice is through a system of enrollment vouchers used in conjunction with deregulation of public schools Cobb explains why watered down plans restricting choice to state controlled schools are sure to fail Reform must be complete In the system he proposes vouchers would be distributed to families for all children of school age and could be redeemed at either public or nonpublic schools of those families choice At the same time public schools would be allowed to operate as effectively as nonpublic schools free of the dead hand of bureaucracy This volume presents a wealth of evidence in support of vouchers describing programs in the United States as well as voucher like systems in other countries The author recounts the success of a voucher system for higher education the GI Bill and cites functioning voucher programs for housing and daycare He establishes that the contest surrounding vouchers is incorrectly seen as a struggle over public or private control of education Instead the political dialogue should be concerned with whether democracy is more likely to thrive where there is diversity fostered by choices If we blot out the distinctive features of subgroups within the United States Cobb warns we will destroy an important source of national strength Even if supporting community poses a risk of too much diversity he finds that a risk worth taking Cobb uses factual case studies to show how vouchers can enable poor families to help themselves Even without a voucher plan a surprising number of low income families already make use of nonpublic schools Desperate to get a child out of a debilitating public school environment a family living below the poverty line may forgo free schooling and choose instead a school where tuition must be paid a heroic act he observes entirely unrecognized by those who attack vouchers as elitist and contrary to democratic principles Cobb also describes how vouchers will offer racial and ethnic minorities the option of supporting integrated schools or of establishing separate schools in which to develop their own community leadership If you think of vouchers as subsidies for the rich this book will change your mind The author s deep belief in the potential of choice to build self governing communities together with the practical evidence he assembles in support of vouchers will give readers hope for the future of our schools and our society The Aptitude Myth Cornelius N. Grove, 2013-06-19 The Aptitude Myth addresses the decline

in American children's mastery of critical school subjects. It contends that a contributing cause for this decline derives from many Americans' ways of thinking about children's learning. They believe that school performance is determined very largely by innate aptitude. The Aptitude Myth traces the deep historical origins, the spread and elaboration, and the eventual triumph of the belief in the determining power of mental abilities given at birth and therefore fixed. Covered is 600 B.C.E. until 1926 when the SAT was first administered. The belief in aptitude assumed by many Americans to be the modern view of learning ability is revealed as an archaic way of thinking that originated in the imaginations of our ancient forebears and gradually gained credibility over 2,500 years. In recent times the belief became elaborated to include the fanciful notion that more than modest academic study injures a child's health. Having inherited this mindset, Americans don't know how to insure that children gain mastery. A new mindset is needed. The final chapter offers a transformative mindset.

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
