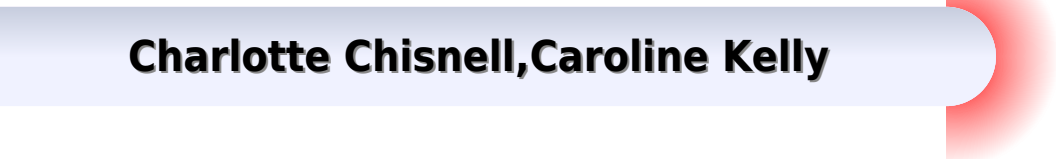

## 100 Citizenship Questions 2014:

*Crimea beyond Rules. Right to nationality (citizenship)* Regional Centre for Human Rights, Ukrainian Helsinki Human Rights Union, Expert-analytical group CHROT, During the occupation and subsequent annexation of the Crimean peninsula the Russian Federation announced all Ukrainian nationals living in Crimea its subjects Residents of the occupied territory faced a difficult choice On the one hand by obtaining Russian passports they formally took the oath of allegiance to the State which had committed an act of aggression against their sovereign country On the other hand during a short period of time in fact 18 days they could try to submit the declaration about the willingness to retain the nationality of Ukraine to one of the four offices which accepted such declarations in Crimea In this case they suddenly became foreigners at home and were severely limited in their rights Using the imperfection of international standards in this ng situations of statelessness and resolving cases of dual nationality Arbitrary change and imposition of a nationality became a new challenge to which the world was not ready Having imposed its nationality the Russian Federation forced into loyalty the population of the occupied peninsula under threat of criminal liability see Art 275 of the Criminal Code High Treason

**Discipline in Education** Johan Botha, 2021 This book addresses a perennial challenge to the success of the South African education system namely discipline This volume steers the interrogation of discipline in a new direction reflecting on ways in which recent research can benefit South African schools This includes the need for alternative discipline that will enhance education The scholarly contribution lies in its in depth exploration of the relevance of research findings to South African schools and to the twenty first century socio political environment For the first time scholarly interrogation of the issue of learner discipline in South African schools draws on indigenous knowledge systems Its post colonial and decolonial perspectives offer an ethical and moral compass for behaviour that could contribute to the well being of South African society and other societies similarly afflicted by anti social behaviour The book offers a range of perspectives on the debates on discipline and associated issues and should stimulate future discussions on discipline and indiscipline at a time when South Africa and many other societies engage with the effects of social and political transformation This scholarly book is aimed at academics and researchers The contributors include philosophers moralists corporativists education law specialists curriculum specialists specialists in education and culture advocates of ubuntu and people using meta syntheses of approaches and practices and religious practices such as a Christian ethical moral approach to parental and school discipline They draw on their insights into postcolonialism the impact of indigenous knowledge theories of agency dysfunctionality and school underperformance The book offers an intriguing depiction of opposing views on discipline

as an invitation to provide a critical appraisal of the current state of the EU legal framework surrounding EU citizenship The contributions are grouped in four parts dealing with constitutional developments posing challenges to EU citizenship the limits of the free movement paradigm in the context of EU citizenship EU citizenship beyond free movement and lastly EU citizenship in the context of the outside world including Brexit the EEA and Eurasian Economic Union *International Migration Outlook 2015* OECD,2015-09-22 This publication analyses recent development in migration movements and policies in OECD countries and some non member countries as well as the evolution of recent labour market outcomes of immigrants in OECD countries It includes a special chapter on Changing Patterns in the international *Egypt* Azmi Bishara,2022-07-14 Azmi Bishara s seminal study of the 2011 Egyptian Revolution chronicles in granular detail the lead up to the momentous uprisings and the subsequent transition and coup The book critically investigates the social and economic conditions that formed the backdrop to the revolution and the complex challenges posed by the transition from authoritarianism to democracy Part One From July Coup to January Revolution goes back to what is called the 1952 revolution or the 1952 Coup d tat and traces events until 2011 when Hosni Mubarak stepped down as the president of Egypt after weeks of protest It highlights the relationship between the presidency and the army to show that contrary to popular belief the presidency grew gradually stronger at the expense of other institutions especially the army and reached its apogee under Mubarak Part Two From Revolution to Coup d Etat covers the critical stages from when the military junta took over the governing of Egypt as the Supreme Council of the Armed Forces SCAF and the election of Morsi up until the coup to overthrow his presidency Using a democratic transition theory perspective Azmi Bishara explains the failure of the democratic transition and how it has impacted on Arab revolutions ever since Written while the revolutions were taking place this book conveys a sense of immediacy and urgency as Bishara makes wide ranging assessments with many of his forecasts corroborated in later years The book is renowned for its use of primary source material including interviews statistics and public opinion polls thus preserving the memory of the revolution and remaining one of the most comprehensive reference books on the subject to date *Sovereign Citizens* Christine M. Sarteschi,2020-07-23 This brief serves to educate readers about the sovereign citizen movement presenting relevant case studies and offering suggestions for measures to address problems caused by this movement Sovereign citizens are considered by the Federal Bureau of Investigation FBI to be a prominent domestic terrorist threat in the United States and are broadly defined as a loosely affiliated anti government group who believes that the United States government and its laws are invalid and fraudulent Because they consider themselves to be immune to the consequences of American law members identifying with this group often engage in criminal activities such as tax fraud paper terrorism and in more extreme cases attempted murder or other acts of violence *Sovereign Citizens* is one of the first scholarly works to explicitly focus on the sovereign citizen movement by explaining the movement s origin interactions with the criminal justice system and ideology **Grassroots Youth Work** De St Croix, Tania,2016-07-05 Some

challenged by two competing poles One pole is centered in xenophobic nationalism Around this pole migrants and refugees are described as criminals religious fanatics and moochers who challenge the working class and the freedoms that come with life in the West The second pole laments the insecurity that migrants and refugees face Around this pole movers are described as victims who lack so much at home In this example migrants and refugees are moving because there are no jobs and few prospects for work civil liberties are proscribed and banned in the face of state imposed limits and there are no opportunities to strike out on a unique path to the future Complicating both poles is the 24 hour news cycle that denies us the opportunity to understand and analyze Instead we are forced to pick one pole or the other In either case the outcome dehumanizes the mover signals their pathos and emphasizes why they are different
