Anatomy

The study of the structure of the human body and its parts.

Physiology

The study of the function of the human body and its parts.

Structural levels

Studying the human body at the cellular, tissue, organ, and system levels.

- 1. **Cellular level** - study of the structure and function of cells.
- 2. **Tissue level** - study of the structure and function of tissues.
- 3. **Organ level** - study of the structure and function of organs.
- 4. **System level** - study of the structure and function of systems.
- 5. **Whole body level** - study of the structure and function of the whole body.

CELLS AND TISSUES

Cells are the basic units of structure and function of the human body.



Organization of cellular levels

Cells are organized into tissues, organs, and systems.

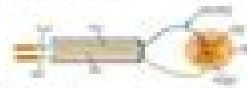
1. **Cellular level** - study of the structure and function of cells.

2. **Tissue level** - study of the structure and function of tissues.

3. **Organ level** - study of the structure and function of organs.

4. **System level** - study of the structure and function of systems.

5. **Whole body level** - study of the structure and function of the whole body.



The **epithelium** is the outermost layer of cells that covers the body.

1. **Epithelial cells** - cells that cover the body.

2. **Connective tissue** - tissue that connects the body.

3. **Muscle tissue** - tissue that contracts the body.

4. **Nervous tissue** - tissue that transmits signals.

5. **Epithelial tissue** - tissue that covers the body.

ORGANS

Organs are structures made up of different types of tissues.

1. **Heart** - pumps blood throughout the body.

2. **Lungs** - exchange gases between the body and the environment.

3. **Stomach** - digests food and absorbs nutrients.

4. **Intestines** - absorb nutrients and eliminate waste.

5. **Kidneys** - filter blood and remove waste.

6. **Liver** - processes nutrients and detoxifies the body.

7. **Spleen** - filters blood and removes old red blood cells.

8. **Thyroid** - produces hormones that regulate metabolism.

9. **Pituitary** - produces hormones that regulate growth and development.

10. **Hypothalamus** - regulates body temperature and hunger.

11. **Adrenal** - produces hormones that regulate stress response.

12. **Testes** - produce sperm and testosterone.

13. **Ovaries** - produce eggs and estrogen.

14. **Uterus** - carries and nurtures the developing fetus.

15. **Vagina** - canal through which the fetus passes during birth.

16. **Bladder** - stores urine before it is excreted.

17. **Urethra** - tube through which urine is excreted.

18. **Rectum** - stores feces before it is excreted.

19. **Anus** - opening through which feces is excreted.

20. **Vagina** - canal through which the fetus passes during birth.

21. **Uterus** - carries and nurtures the developing fetus.

22. **Placenta** - organ that provides nutrients to the fetus.

23. **Cord** - tube that connects the fetus to the placenta.

24. **Amnion** - membrane that surrounds the fetus.

25. **Chorion** - outermost membrane that surrounds the fetus.

26. **Decidua** - tissue that lines the uterus.

27. **Perineum** - area between the anus and the vagina.

28. **Vulva** - opening of the vagina.

29. **Clitoris** - small, sensitive organ that provides sexual pleasure.

30. **Labia** - folds of skin that surround the vagina.

31. **G-spot** - sensitive area on the inner wall of the vagina.

32. **Orgasm** - pleasurable sensation that occurs during sexual intercourse.

33. **Ejaculation** - release of sperm from the testes.

34. **Erection** - state of being hard and ready for sexual intercourse.

35. **Penetration** - act of inserting the penis into the vagina.

36. **Intercourse** - sexual activity involving the penis and the vagina.

37. **Coitus** - another term for intercourse.

38. **Sexual satisfaction** - feeling of pleasure and fulfillment during sexual activity.

39. **Sexual health** - state of being free from sexual diseases and disorders.

40. **Sexual wellness** - state of being physically, mentally, and emotionally healthy.

41. **Sexual pleasure** - feeling of enjoyment and satisfaction during sexual activity.

42. **Sexual desire** - feeling of wanting to have sex.

43. **Sexual attraction** - feeling of being drawn to someone.

44. **Sexual interest** - feeling of curiosity and fascination about someone.

45. **Sexual arousal** - state of being excited and ready for sexual activity.

46. **Sexual stimulation** - act of touching or rubbing the body.

47. **Sexual contact** - physical touch between two people.

48. **Sexual intimacy** - feeling of closeness and connection with someone.

49. **Sexual bonding** - feeling of attachment and commitment to someone.

50. **Sexual love** - feeling of deep affection and care for someone.

SYSTEMS

Systems are groups of organs that work together to perform a function.

1. **Cardiovascular system** - pumps blood throughout the body.

2. **Respiratory system** - exchanges gases between the body and the environment.

3. **Digestive system** - breaks down food and absorbs nutrients.

4. **Excretory system** - removes waste from the body.

5. **Immune system** - defends the body against disease.

6. **Nervous system** - controls the body's responses to the environment.

7. **Endocrine system** - produces hormones that regulate the body.

8. **Musculoskeletal system** - supports the body and enables movement.

9. **Integumentary system** - covers the body and protects it from the environment.

10. **Reproductive system** - produces offspring.

11. **Urinary system** - filters blood and removes waste.

12. **Thyroid system** - produces hormones that regulate metabolism.

13. **Pituitary system** - produces hormones that regulate growth and development.

14. **Hypothalamic system** - regulates body temperature and hunger.

15. **Adrenal system** - produces hormones that regulate stress response.

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NERVOUS SYSTEM

Neurons

Neurons are the basic units of the nervous system.

1. **Cell body** - contains the nucleus and other organelles.

2. **Dendrites** - receive signals from other neurons.

3. **Axon** - carries signals away from the cell body.

4. **Myelin sheath** - covers the axon and speeds up signal transmission.

5. **Synapse** - junction between two neurons.

6. **Neurotransmitter** - chemical messenger that carries signals across the synapse.

7. **Receptor** - receives signals from the environment.

8. **Effector** - carries out the response to a signal.

9. **Control center** - processes information and makes decisions.

10. **Feedback loop** - maintains balance in the body.

11. **Homeostasis** - the body's ability to maintain a stable internal environment.

12. **Adaptation** - the body's ability to change in response to the environment.

13. **Evolution** - the process of change in the characteristics of a population over time.

14. **Speciation** - the process of new species formation.

15. **Extinction** - the process of a species disappearing.

16. **Conservation** - the protection of natural resources.

17. **Restoration** - the process of returning a natural area to its original state.

18. **Rehabilitation** - the process of helping someone recover from an injury or illness.

19. **Recovery** - the process of returning to a normal state after a period of illness or injury.

20. **Healing** - the process of repairing damage to the body.

21. **Regeneration** - the process of replacing lost or damaged tissue.

22. **Repair** - the process of fixing damage to the body.

CELLS OF TISSUES

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
