Liberty** Daniel Farber,2008-04-24 In the weeks following 9 11 the Bush administration launched the Patriot Act rejected key provisions of the Geneva Convention and inaugurated a sweeping electronic surveillance program for intelligence purposes all in the name of protecting national security But the current administration is hardly unique in pursuing such measures In Security v Liberty Daniel Farber leads a group of prominent historians and legal experts in exploring the varied ways in which threats to national security have affected civil liberties throughout American history Has the government s response to such threats led to a gradual loss of freedoms once taken for granted or has the nation learned how to restore civil liberties after threats subside and how to put protections in place for the future Security v Liberty focuses on periods of national emergency in the twentieth century from World War I through the Vietnam War to explore how past episodes might bear upon today s dilemma Distinguished historian Alan Brinkley shows that during World War I the government targeted vulnerable groups including socialists anarchists and labor leaders not because of a real threat to the nation but because it was politically expedient to scapegoat unpopular groups Nonetheless within ten years the Supreme Court had rolled back the most egregious of the World War I restrictions on civil liberties Legal scholar John Yoo argues for the legitimacy of the Bush administration s War on Terror policies such as the detainment and trials of suspected al Qaeda members by citing historical precedent in the Roosevelt administration s prosecution of World War II Yoo contends that compared to Roosevelt s sweeping use of executive orders Bush has exercised relative restraint in curtailing civil liberties Law professor Geoffrey Stone describes how J Edgar Hoover used domestic surveillance to harass anti war protestors and civil rights groups throughout the 1960s and early 1970s Congress later enacted legislation to prevent a recurrence of the Hoover era excesses but Stone notes that the Bush administration has argued for the right to circumvent some of these restrictions in its campaign against terrorism Historian Jan Ellen Lewis looks at early U S history to show how an individual s civil liberties often depended on the extent to which he or she fit the definition of American as the country s borders expanded Legal experts Paul Schwartz and Ronald Lee examine the national security implications of rapid advances in information technology which is increasingly driven by a highly globalized private sector rather than by the U S

the most demanding jobs in the world **Los Angeles Transformed** Tom Sitton, 2005 When Fletcher Bowron 1887 1968 ran for mayor of Los Angeles in 1938 his twelve years as a superior court judge with a reputation for honesty and fairness carried him to victory against a notoriously corrupt incumbent During his nearly fifteen years as a neo progressive mayor Bowron presided over fundamental reforms in the police department public utilities and other agencies charged with basic services rooting out bribery kickbacks and influence peddling World War II brought economic and population booms racial conflict social dislocation and environmental problems to Los Angeles and complicated Mayor Bowron s job After the war Bowron initiated massive public housing and desegregation projects These forward looking programs alienated enough voters to cost him the 1953 election as his leftist supporters fell away under the influence of McCarthyism This political history of the mid twentieth century reform period in Los Angeles is also a case study of the ways outside events can affect municipal affairs As Tom Sitton demonstrates the choices made during Bowron s administration have had a direct bearing on how Los Angeles looks today and how its government operates The American Road Katherine M. Johnson, 2021-06-23 In The American Road Katherine M Johnson develops a bold new theory for how the American highway system has taken on such outsized scale and complexity by emphasizing the emergence of a powerful administrative apparatus in the American federal system Established in 1914 expressly to intervene in the congressional debates of the era the American highway bureaucracy consisted of forty eight state highway officials acting in and through their self organized association the American Association of State Highway Officials Johnson s central argument is that this new institution occupied a similar position relative to the American state as political parties and courts did The capacity to organize across a complex constitutional order enabled it to control the purpose and allocation of federal highway aid for the better part of the twentieth century Johnson investigates this new conception of the American highway bureaucracy showing specifically where and how that extraconstitutional authority emerged expanded and manifested itself in the legislative history physical dimensions and geographical reach of the emerging highway system The American Road reveals that all of the major highway legislation approved by Congress from 1916 to 1941 was collectively developed and advanced by state and federal highway bureaucrats drawing on the new authority conferred by the system of federal grants in aid which required state legislatures to provide a state matching grant and local governments to relinquish control over decisions of location and design The capacity to advance their policy aims through both the advice of experts and the will of the states not only secured the new highway program against renewed opposition in Congress in the 1920s but also won the strong support of the motor vehicle industry and set the stage for even more impressive policy gains of the 1930s when highways became the largest category of federal emergency public works That collective authority however required a high threshold of consensus to secure and maintain producing not just a narrow one size fits all approach to technical issues but also a striking incapacity to respond to changing conditions Johnson completes her compelling narrative by identifying the source of the interstate

highway plan first proposed in 1939 and finally funded in 1956 in the internal dynamics of and external threats to that extraconstitutional authority

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
