(4th form orphans are sleeping behind)

Molly: (Molly is having a nightmare) Mamma! Mommy!

Pepper: Molly wake up and shut up so I can sleep!

July: Ah, leave Molly alone (Molly keeps mounting and shouting Mommy)

Carol: Oh, shut up Molly!

Susy: Oh, my goodness Stop it! I want to get some sleep!

Mary: Leave her, she's not doing anything to you

Pepper: She's keeping us awake, isn't she?

Sarah: No. YOU are keeping us awake!

All Orphans: (scream as Pepper beats up July)

Jame: Oh, my goodness. Now they are fighting and I won't get any sleep.

Annie: (shows Papper off of July) Stop it! Lay off July! If Hannigan wakes up she'll get sore! It's OK

Molly, it's me, Annie, you were just having a nightmare.

Molly: I miss my mommy and daddy.

Annie: You have to get back to sleep

Pepper: Uh, Molly we haven't got parents and we won't ever going to have them. That's why we're called orphans!

Annie: I'm not an orphan! My parents are alive and they're coming to get me someday.

Orphan (Vicky G): Yeah! And Annie's got a note that proves it! (Sticks out tongue at Papper)

Molly: Will you read it to me Annie?

July: Oh, brother

Pepper: Here we go again.

Susy: Oh my goodness, not again!!

Annie: (Reading the note) Please take care of our little darling, her name is Annie. We will be back to get her soon. She was born

Pepper and Annie: Born on October the 28th

Pepper, Annie, and July + orphans: We have left half a silver locket around her neck and kept the other half, so that when we come back for her you will know that she's our baby.

(Pepper and July laugh)

Annie: Do you want to sleep with your teeth inside your mouth or out? Now get to sleep! I know these don't mean anything to you, but they're everything to me. They prove I've got parents.

Molly: Do you really think they're out there Annie?

Lucy: I dream about having a father and a mother again...

Annie: Yes!, and I'm going to meet them someday.

SONG - MAYBE (Lucy Annie and other orphans)

(As the song ends Annie begins putting some stuff into a bag)

July: (waking up) What now?

Annie: If my folks haven't found me then I'm going to find them.

Pepper: Again?

Annie: (shines flashlight in Pepper's eyes) Pepper! Watch out for Molly!

Molly: But what if Miss Hannigan catches you?

Annie: She won't.

(Annie creeps either to the side of the stage or behind curtain to give the orphans a chance to leave she may then sneak around the other side)

Ms. Hannigan: Boo! Trying to make a break, again! (grabs flashlight from Annie)

(Annie turns over in a position as to be spanked)

Ms. Hannigan: What are you doing?

Annie: Aren't yoy going to beat the tar out of me?

Ms. Hannigan: Have I ever hit any of you?
