Describe the healing of the head lacerations, and the role of sutures in that process. - ANS--Wound Healing Process:

- Severed blood vessels bleed
- 2. Inflammatory chemicals are released
- Local blood vessels become more permeable, allowing WBCs, fluid, clotting proteins, and other plasma proteins to seep into the injured area
- 4. Clotting occurs; surface dries and forms a scab
- The clot is replaced by granulation tissue, which restores the vascular supply
- 6. Fibroblasts produce collagen fibers that bridge the gap
- Macrophages phagocytize dead and dying cells and other debris
- 8. Surface epithelial cells multiply and migrate over the granulation tissue
- 9. The fibrosed area matures and contracts; the epithelium thickens
- 10. A fully generated epithelium with an underlying area of scar tissue results -Sutures hold the edges the laceration together to:
- Reduce size
- Speed up healing process
- Improve appearance
- Improve tissue function

- so even though the fracture is displaced but is not open healing process of fractures
- fractures will be immobilized
- o cast or boot
- keep the bones still during the healing process
- -Fracture Healing Process:
- 1. Hematoma formation clot forms, then osteogenic cells form granulation tissue
- 2. Soft callus formation fibroblasts produce fibers and fibrocartilage
- 3. Hard callus formation osteoblasts produce a bony collar in 6 weeks
- 4. Bone remodeling spongy bone replaced by compact bone
