DEFINITION

An analytical thesis is a statement that presents an argument by breaking down a topic into its components and evaluating their significance. It does not simply state a fact but analyzes how and why something works, often using evidence to support its claims.

EXAMPLE

In George Orwell's 1984, the Party maintains control through surveillance, propaganda, and psychological manipulation, demonstrating how totalitarian regimes erode individual autonomy.
