asiento system - correct answer This system required that a tax be paid to the King of Spain, for slaves that were imported to the Americas. (p. 8)

slavery - correct answer As far back as the 1500s the Spanish brought captured Africans to America to provide free labor. (p. 11)

land bridge - correct answer Some time between 10,000 and 40,000 years ago, people migrated from Asia to the Americas, across this area that connected Siberia and Alaska. (p. 2)

Adena-Hopewell - correct answer This American Indian culture centered in Ohio created large earthen mounds as tall as 300 feet. (p. 4)

Hokokam, Anasazi, and Pueblos - correct answer These American Indians were located in the New Mexico and Arizona region. They developed farming using irrigation systems. (p. 4)

Woodland mound builders - correct answer American Indian tribe east of the Mississippi that prospered because of a rich food supply. (p. 4)
