question incorrectly Try to use the guessing strategy but if you are truly stumped by a question remember that you do not have to answer it Work quickly and steadily You have a limited amount of time to work on each section so you need to work quickly and steadily Avoid focusing on one problem for too long Before the Test Make sure you know where your test center is well in advance of your test day so you do not get lost on the day of the test On the night before the test gather together the materials you will need the next day Your admission ticket Two forms of identification e q driver s license student identification card or current alien registration card Two No 2 pencils with erasers Directions to the test center A watch if you wish but not one that makes noise as it may disturb other test takers.
