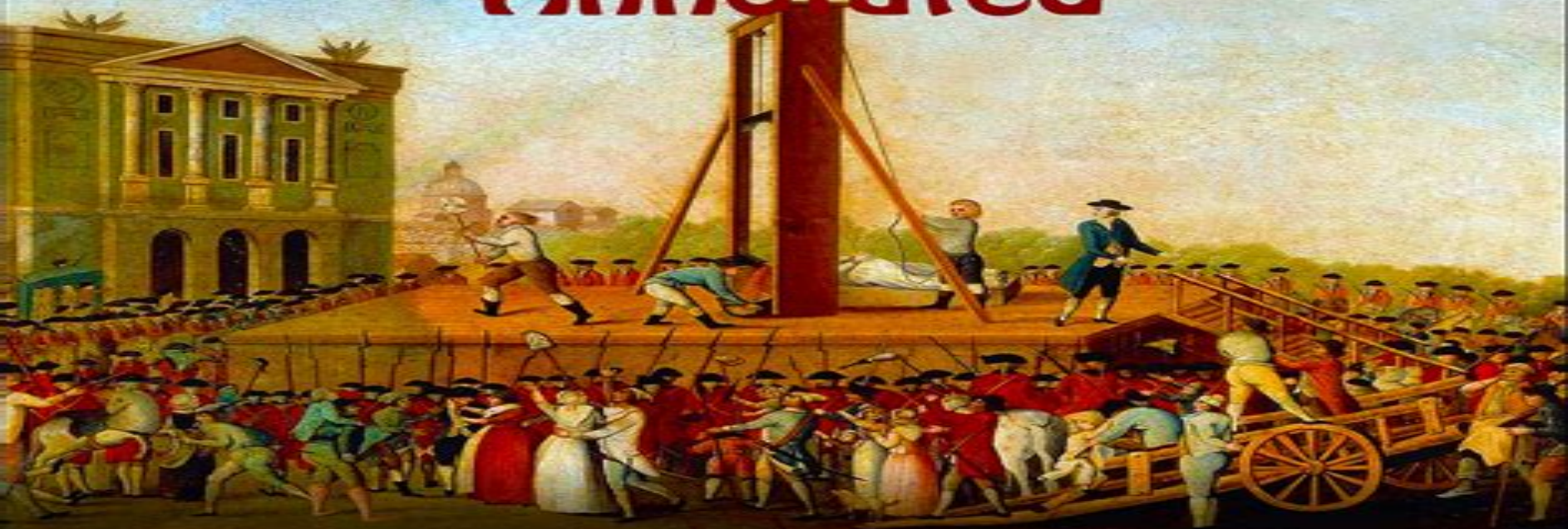

With singular dramatic vivacity, much constructive art, and with descriptive passages of a high order everywhere, there was probably never a book by a great humorist and an artist so prolific in conception with so little humor and so few remarkable figures.
