Reviving Ancient Chinese Mathematics Jiri Hudecek, 2014-07-25 Twentieth century China has been caught between a desire to increase its wealth and power in line with other advanced nations which by implication means copying their institutions practices and values whilst simultaneously seeking to preserve China's independence and historically formed identity Over time Chinese philosophers writers artists and politicians have all sought to reconcile these goals and this book shows how this search for a Chinese way penetrated even the most central least contested area of modernity science *Reviving Ancient Chinese Mathematics* is a study of the life of one of modern China's most admired scientific figures the mathematician Wu Wen Tsun Negotiating the conflict between progress and tradition he found a path that not only ensured his political and personal survival but which also brought him renown as a mathematician of international status who claimed that he stood outside the dominant western tradition of mathematics Wu Wen Tsun's story highlights crucial developments and contradictions in twentieth century China the significance of which extends far beyond the field of mathematics On one hand lies the appeal of radical scientific modernity mechanisation in all its forms and competitiveness within the international scientific community On the other is an anxiety to preserve national traditions and make them part of the modernisation project Moreover Wu's intellectual

development also reflects the complex relationship between science and Maoist ideology because his turn to history was powered by his internalisation of certain aspects of Maoist ideology including its utilitarian philosophy of science This book traces how Wu managed to combine political success and international scientific eminence a story that has wider implications for a new century of increasing Chinese activity in the sciences As such it will be of great interest to students and scholars of Chinese history the history of science and the history and philosophy of mathematics

Writing Early China Edward L. Shaughnessy, 2023-11-01 Archaeological discoveries over the past one hundred years have resulted in repeated calls to rewrite ancient Chinese history This is especially true of documents written on oracle bones bronze vessels and bamboo strips In Writing Early China Edward L Shaughnessy surveys all of these types of documents and considers what they reveal about the creation and transmission of knowledge in ancient China Opposed to the common view that most knowledge was transmitted orally in ancient China Shaughnessy demonstrates that by no later than the tenth century BCE scribes were writing lengthy texts like portions of the Chinese classics and that by the fourth century BCE the primary mode of textual transmission was by way of visual copying from one manuscript to another

Brown, 2024 Aquinas and the Early Chinese Masters lays intellectual foundations for the integration of Chinese philosophy into Catholic theology Although Catholic theology in Chinese contexts has drawn upon Chinese philosophical concepts few have attempted to develop a rigorous systematic approach to testing what in the Chinese philosophical traditions can be fruitful or unfruitful for Catholic theological expression This book attempts to model such an approach by engaging classical Chinese philosophy with the mind and spirit of St Thomas Aquinas who read Aristotle and other pagan philosophers with both charitable appreciation and a firm critical eye It applies this Thomistic lens through concrete comparative engagements with three main representatives of early Chinese philosophy Mencius Mengzi Xunzi and Mozi In each chapter the book presents Aquinas thought as an evaluative frame for perceiving how Chinese philosophical commitments and concepts do or do not seem fit for adoption into Catholic theological science Following the general structure of the Summa theologiae the book is comprised of six chapters touching on the doctrine of God morality and

Christology The first two chapters engage Confucian master Mengzi's notion of Heaven Tian and then the Mohist doctrine of Heaven's Will Tian zhi Chapter three provides a Thomistic assessment of the two main positions in the classical Confucian debate on the goodness of man's moral nature renxing Chapter four compares Aquinas' account of charity and Mozi's doctrine of universal love jian ai Chapter 5 offers a Thomistic assessment of the possibility of understanding Christ in terms of Xunzi's sage shengren Finally Chapter 6 explores Christ as a moral teacher by putting Aquinas' reading of Matt 8:21-22 into conversation with Confucian ethics of filial virtue
