First-generation immigrants are more costly to governments than are the native-born, but the second generation are among the strongest fiscal and economic contributors in the U.S. This report concludes that immigration has an overall positive impact on long-run economic growth in the U.S. More than 40 million people living in the United States were born in other countries, and almost an equal number have at least one foreign-born parent. Together, the first-generation foreign-born and second-generation children of the foreign-born comprise almost one in four Americans. It comes as little

Regulating Pharmaceutical Prices in India Ajay Bhaskarabhatla, 2018-08-01 This book presents an extensive study on the effectiveness of recent regulations on pharmaceutical prices in India exploring the weaknesses in the design and implementation of pharmaceutical price controls and investigating what can be done to fix the broken system In addition it examines the extent to which essential medicines are actually made affordable by price controls The book argues that companies make the pharmaceutical price control regime largely ineffective by coordinating to increase pre regulation prices by diversifying horizontally away from the regulated markets and increasing prices in the unregulated markets by manipulating trade margins and by refusing to comply with the regulation because the penalties remains negligible The book draws on extensive empirical research involving India's 2013 Drug Price Control Order and widely used medicines such as paracetamol and metformin to illustrate how firms have weakened regulation It argues that the regulatory regime can be strengthened by using systematic analysis of product and region level data in the Indian pharmaceutical industry and by screening for the strategies that firms currently employ to circumvent regulation In closing it discusses recent efforts to

strengthen the implementation of price controls in India and expanding the scope of price controls to medical devices
