SNAP and community based programs such as food pantries and home delivered meals are intended to help address the issue of food insecurity they are typically inadequate to address the needs of food insecure older adults SNAP has enrollment and maintenance procedures that are particularly difficult for older adults to navigate pays out an insufficient amount of money to cover food costs and varies greatly by state Availability of community programs varies by municipality often lacks nutritious foods that are complementary to health conditions common among older adults and can be difficult to access due to a lack of reliable transportation disability or cost Heflin and Harrington Meyer advocate for addressing all the issues that increase older adults risk of food insecurity not just financial barriers.
