- Make connections to the title. Text-to-self, text-to-text. or text-to-world.
- Read the poem.
- 5. What jumps out at you during and after this read?
- Going line by line, think about what the poet, speaker, or narrator of the poem is trying to communicate. Determine the main idea.
- Identify any poetic devices.
- Re-read as many times as you need in order to make sense of the poem.
